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2019 ISO Ethanol Yearbook

The ISO is pleased to announce that preparations for the **2019 ISO Ethanol Yearbook** are already under way. The new edition of the Ethanol Yearbook is expected to offer over 100 pages of both statistics and in-depth analysis of the world fuel ethanol market. The book will include data on world fuel ethanol production, consumption and trade as well as individual national balances with data series on production, import, export, consumption, stocks and prices for key countries. Additional tables with data on ethanol sucrose content in cane, sugar cane/beet pricing, government policy and mandated biofuel inclusions, alternative feedstocks and ethanol vs. sugar realization, among others, are also included.
