SOUTH AFRICA - Sugar tax to lower demand by 200,000mt: SASA

The finance minister will announce the health promotion levy (HPL) soon, according to the South African Sugar Association (SASA), who said the tax will be implemented on April 1 and fixed at ZAR 2.1c/g (USD 0.17c/g) for drinks with a sugar content above 4g/100ml. The association estimated that the tax would lower sugar demand in the domestic market by 200,000mt and put 13,200ha of cane plantations out of production. ([Farmers Weekly](#))
