Sugar sales have fallen by 27% due to the sugar tax imposition and the import of cheap sugar, according to Illovo South Africa. The decline is due to beverage companies reformulating their products to cut sugar content and reducing portion sizes. In addition, the local industry will be hit if the government does not hike tariffs to curb imports, SA Cane Growers Association's vice-chairperson said in an opinion piece.
